## Two Lake Collaborative Sewer Authority Enlists Help of Rural Water Experts

(MANISTEE COUNTY, MI) — The Two Lake Collaborative Sewer Authority (TLCSA) is working with the Michigan Rural Water Association to organize and answer questions regarding the proposed low-pressure sewage collection system for areas of Bear Lake Township, Pleasanton Township, Onekama Township, and The Village of Bear Lake.

In a process that spanned several months, more than 300 questions were gathered electronically and during in-person informational meetings from members of the public who own property within the project's boundaries.

The Michigan Rural Water Association, formed in 1990, is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization whose mission includes protecting the public health by ensuring the provision of safe drinking water and compliance with federal and state rules, regulations, and standards.

The TLCSA hopes to have answers available for review by the end of May, but stress that the focus is not to rush the process, but, rather, to provide factual, objective answers to residents.
