Group Gathering Answers to More than 300 Questions

(MANISTEE COUNTY, MI) — Following a successful effort to collect questions from the community, the Two Lake Collaborative Sewer Authority (TLCA) is now working with experts to gather answers.

The TLCA is proposing a public sewage collection and treatment system for select properties in Onekama Township, Bear Lake Township, Pleasanton Township, and the Village of Bear Lake. The purpose of the system is to protect the waters of Bear Lake and Portage Lake and protect the health of residents who live on and enjoy the lakes.

The system would connect more than 1,400 homes to a low-pressure sewage collection system, replacing the need for each home to have its own on-site septic system and wastewater disposal field.

Ultimately, the TLCA will find factual and objective answers to each question collected and for any questions that cannot be answered, that will be made clear. The TLCA will make those answers available to the public as soon as thorough and unbiased answers can be gathered.
